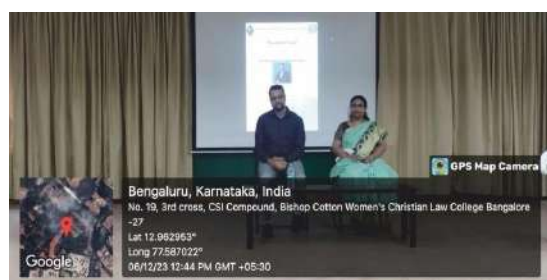
SEMINAR ON ELEVATING TAX SYSTEM-VIKSIT BHARAT@2047

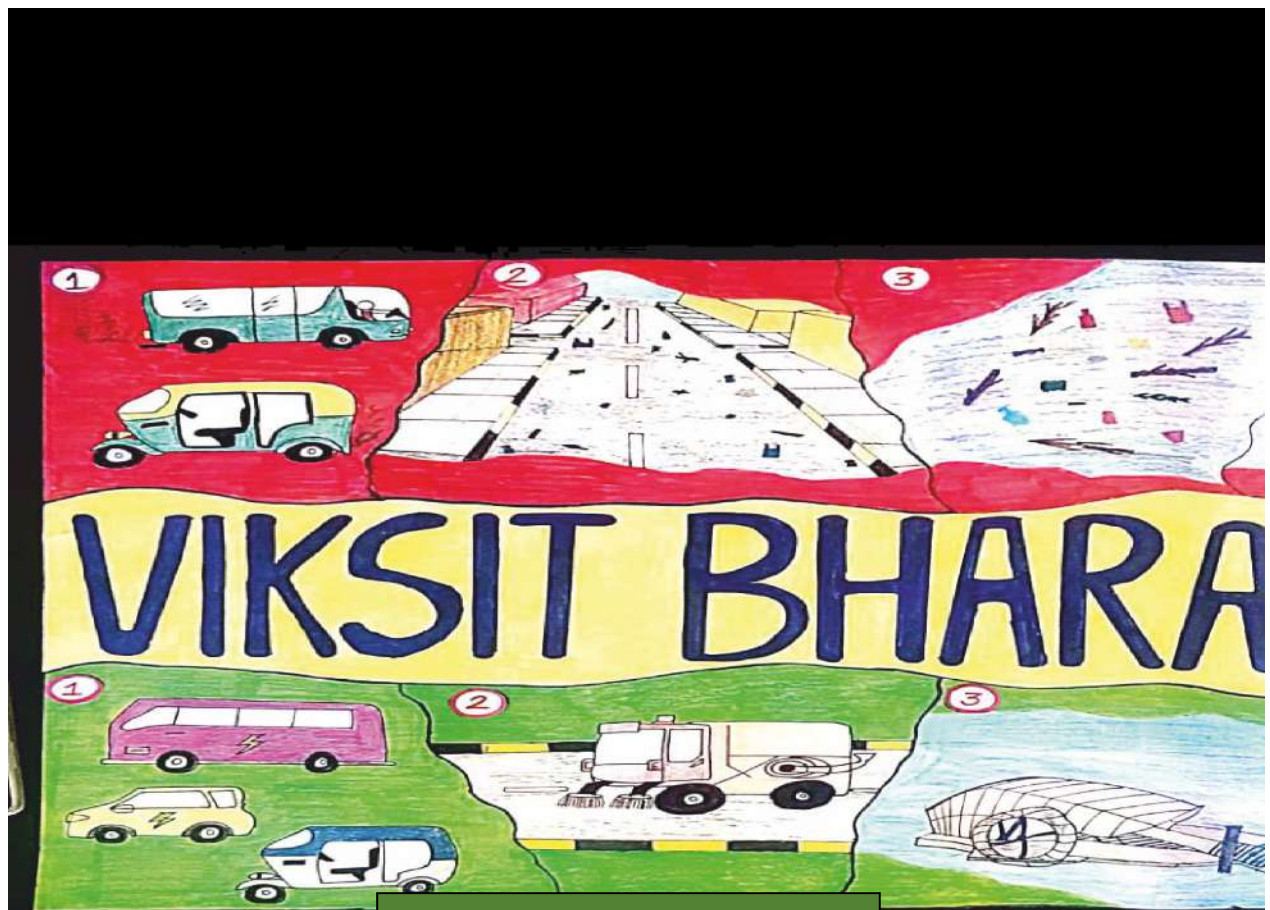
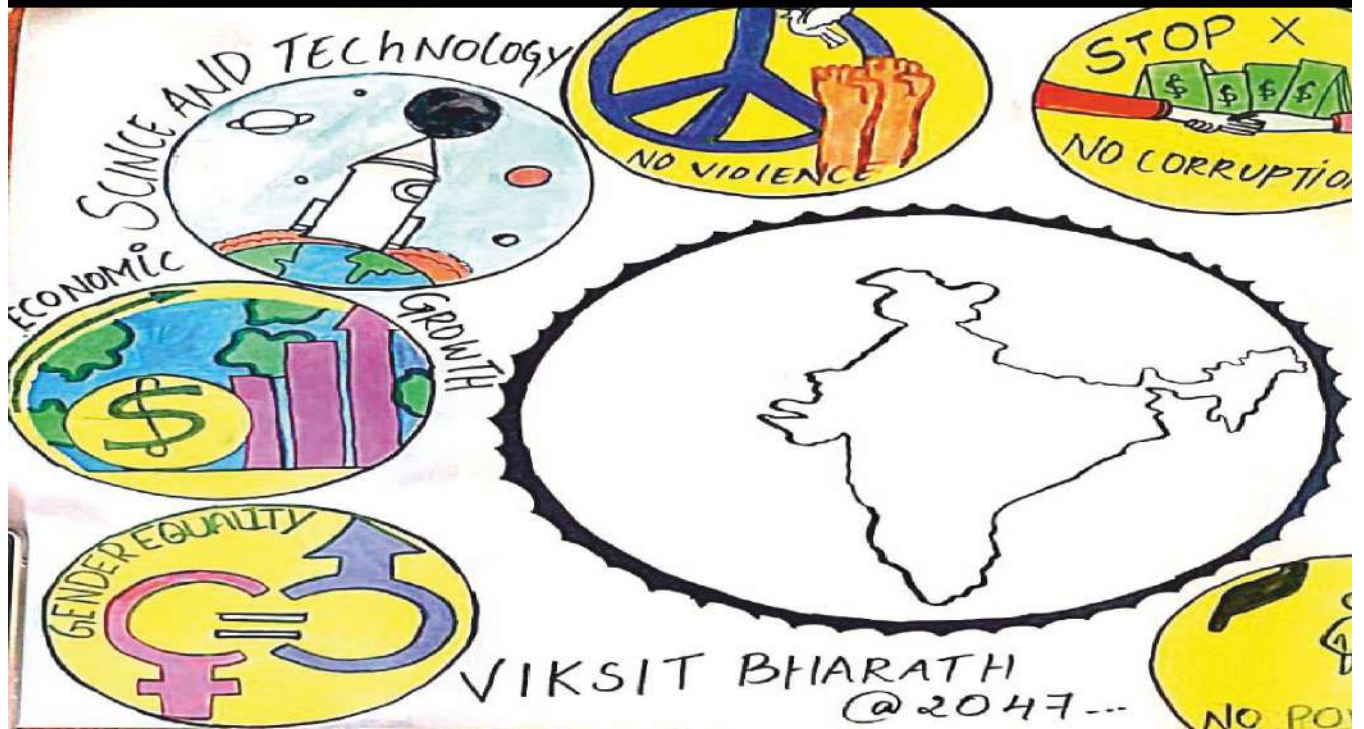
*In halls of learning, where dreams Grow;
